2. Create and complete your learner profile.
3. Under Manage Groups, in the text field under Join By Group Code, enter HIVCBA and click Join.
4. Click the Save button in the upper right hand corner of the page.
5. Click Close.
6. Search courses or training plans to find relevant content.

  - a. Click Register.
  - b. Choose the course(s) you are interested in, review details, and register if eligible.
  - c. To view all upcoming courses click on Calendar and apply filter for CDC Events. Available trainings will be listed in blue. Repeat step b (above).
  - d. Note: many courses have pre-course training modules as pre-requisites and some require advance approval (please check course information and contact the appropriate person if required).
