## **COMMUNITY MESSAGING**



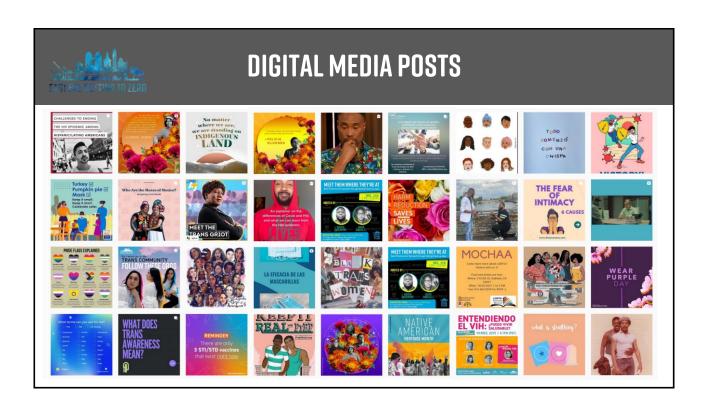
**Vision:** An East Bay-specific campaign with multigenerational, multicultural and multilingual messaging that inspires hope and reaches all our communities.

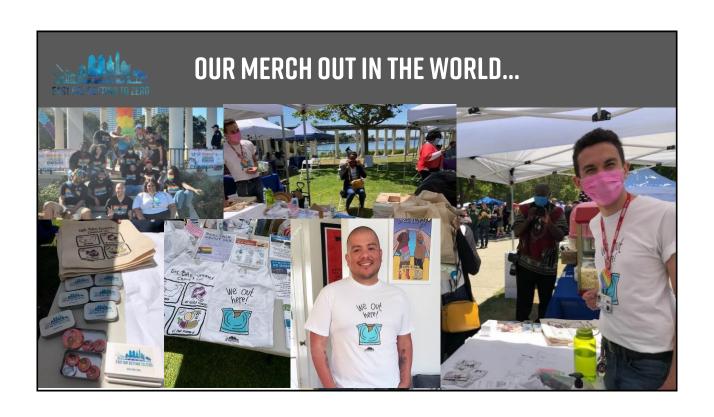
### **Accomplishments:**

- o Community messaging working group
- o Digital social media and influencer engagement
- Custom gear and campaigns with art from local artists in key communities: East Bae Summer and Sexy Loteria
- Community trainings on social media and outreach via dating apps









## **COMMUNITY MESSAGING**



### Needs/gaps:

- O A greater focus on the experiences and stories of people impacted by HIV
- O Strong social media presence/infrastructure network-wide
- Ongoing commitment to innovation and willingness to try new approaches

### Plans for 2022:

- o Murals led by local artists in key communities
- Transit ad campaigns focused on key communities
- Regional campaign in collaboration with nearby **Bay Area counties**



# **YOUTH ENGAGEMENT**





Vision: Engage youth and youth-centered partners in community messaging and outreach, low-barrier PrEP and sexual health care, and build the youth leadership pipeline.

## **Accomplishments:**

- Regional youth engagement group
- Launch of youth internship program with 2 youth interns!
- East Bay Prevention Meeting focused on Youth Services Part 1 (Sept 2021): Community Orgs Part 2 (Jan 2022): School-Based Health Centers



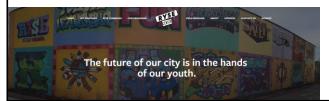
# **YOUTH ENGAGEMENT**

## Needs/gaps:

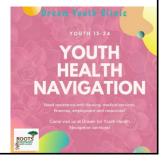
- Lower the barriers to quality sexual health care
- · Focus on positive youth development

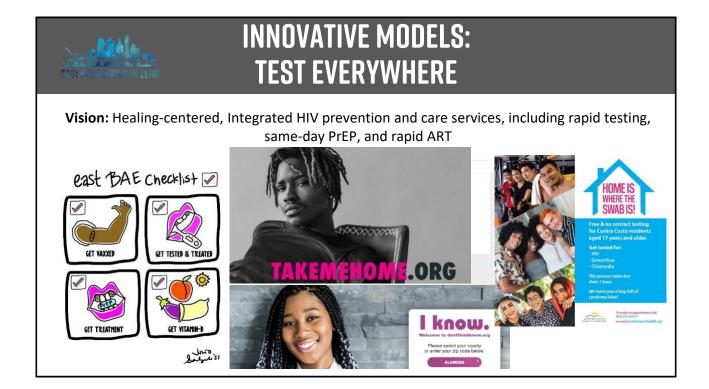
### Plans for 2022:

- Sex-positive messaging in Oakland schools (for youth, families, educators, and community)











# INNOVATIVE MODELS: SAME-DAY PREP

**Vision:** Healing-centered, Integrated HIV prevention and care services, including rapid testing, same-day PrEP, and rapid ART

#### Sites with Same-Day PrEP Packs

- 3 Community Health Centers (over 10 clinical sites)
- 3 youth clinics
- 2 school-based health centers
- 2 clinics serving people experiencing homelessness

#### Exploring:

- 1 Emergency Room
- 1 Mobile Clinic Van



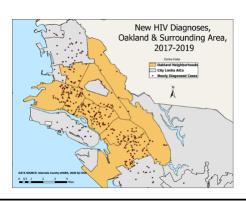






# INNOVATIVE MODELS: ONE-STOP SHOPS

Vision: Healing-centered, integrated HIV prevention and care services, including rapid testing, same-day PrEP, and rapid ART







HOPE: Healthy Outcomes for People Everywhere
Oakland-Based Status-Neutral Mobile Health Clinic





## **INNOVATIVE MODELS**

**Vision:** Healing-centered, integrated HIV prevention and care services, including rapid testing, same-day PrEP, and rapid ART

### **Accomplishments:**

- Launch of home HIV testing across East Bay
- Rapid test and PrEP starter pack pilots at community health centers, including 5 youth sites

### Needs/gaps:

- Full HIV/STI home testing for all genders & body parts
- Direct services in neighborhoods most affected by HIV

#### Plans for 2022:

- HOPE Mobile Health Clinic
- Free Same-day PrEP in all clinics





# **IMPROVING COLLABORATIONS**



### **Accomplishments:**

- One place to find info: revamped service directory.
- Network-wide quarterly meetings on ED, SUD, housing.
- Strengthened linkages in non-HIV settings: Emergency department, substance use, street and shelter settings.

## Impact:

- Highland linkage rates increased 44% to 73%
- Highland ED started 72% of newly diagnosed people on rapid ART.







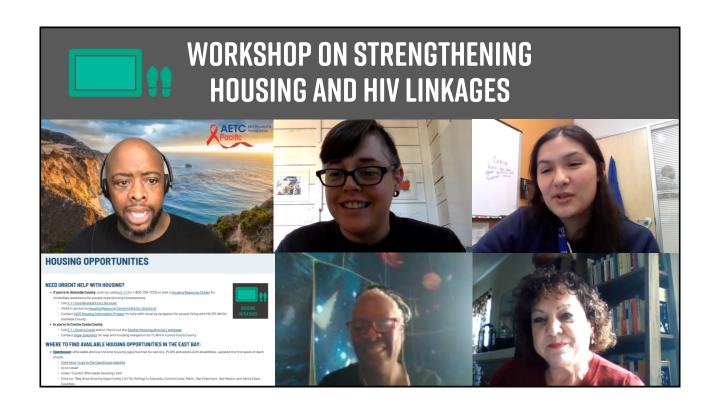
## **HOUSING INITIATIVES**



## **Accomplishments:**

- Creation of new housing working group led by advocates.
- Cross-training, coordination and info exchange with network-wide housing workshop in October 2021.
- Exploration of housing policy changes.

**Impact:** 43 PLWH housed; Trust clinic viral load suppression increased 35% to 50%; 344 people experiencing homelessness screened for HIV and 96% PLWH linked to care.
