

Emergency & transitional housing for people experiencing homelessness

Myeeka Calhoun, East Oakland Community Project

Myeeka Calhoun is a community activist, who has worked as a Housing Advocate in Alameda County for over 20+ years. She has been an Advanced Community Health Outreach Worker for people living with HIV within those 20 + years.

Currently, Myeeka is the Case Management Services Manager at East Oakland Community Project- Crossroads Emergency Shelter. She is also a member of the Oakland Transitional Grant Area Planning Council (OTGA).

Myeeka is also a member of the HOPE (Healthy Outcomes for People Everywhere) Coalition, which is focused on working with African-American people experiencing homelessness in Alameda County impacted by HIV, and STIs.

Recently, Myeeka has also become a member of the CAN (Community Advisory Network) facilitated by Family Paths.

Community Announcements

Addressing the needs of undocumented clients of the Latinx community

Carmen Foster, La Clinica de la Raza

Carmen Foster, a dedicated advocate for the Latinx LGBTQAI+ community, serves as the clinic manager of TRUCHA, the HIV services department at La Clinica de la Raza.

Born in Guatemala, Carmen migrated to the US at the age of 14, bringing with her a commitment to serving marginalized communities.

Her journey in HIV advocacy began in 2003 in Orange County, California, where she started as a volunteer at the AIDS Services Foundation, now known as Radiant Health Center.

Carmen's passion and dedication led her to join the HIV team as a case manager and HIV testing counselor. She also played a vital role in organizing a family camp for children and families affected by HIV.

In 2008, Carmen joined TRUCHA at La Clinica and relocated to the Bay Area. Here, she worked tirelessly with the TRUCHA team and the Street Level Health Project to connect day laborers to vital healthcare services. Additionally, carmen served as a clinical health educator at the School Based Health Centers.

Carmen's commitment to advancing HIV research and education led her to collaborate with San Francisco State University and UCSF. Notably, she played a pivotal role in establishing De Colores, a safe space and Latinx youth group focused on HIV prevention education.
